

I JOHN

John will give us 5 very clear reasons why he wrote this book. Assuming those in 2:12-14 aren't actually reasons, but rather more a qualifying of his recipients, then 2 reasons will be in ch. 1, 2 in ch. 2, and 1 in ch. 5. Be sure to write them below.

As you go through this book, you will need to decide whether the recipients are Christians or not. List at least 3 scriptures to support your conclusion.

I JOHN

John spends a great deal of time conveying “cause and effect” in this letter. You will see several statements of “if/then” statements or the like. See how many of them you can list below. Put the cause on the left and the result on the right.

1. John (and those with him) have had at least 4 different types of encounters with “that which is from the beginning.” What are those 4 encounters?

7. Building on that premise, John gives us an if/then statement. The consequence would be that we lie and do not practice the truth. What would be the cause?

8. Then we have another cause and effect, again building on that premise. The cause is “if we walk in the light as He is in the light.” What is the effect (2)?

9. Next, we have 3 things we can do with sin. Again, consider that this is building on the premise that God is light. First of all, what are the 3 things we can do with sin?

Application

- Looking at your life, how much of it is spent in the light of the Lord, and how much is spent walking in the darkness of this world? The Lord has not called us to live a dichotomous relationship with Him!
- Pray that you would cast off anything that looks like darkness and live in the light of the Lord! The good news is that (as we see in this passage) He is in the business of forgiving and cleansing us!

 9. We have another cause and effect following. The cause is to walk as He walked. What is the effect?

 10. Now, we have the fun vs. 7-8! The term “commandment” is used 4 times. What is the old commandment (note: this will be defined in the following chapter)?

 11. Yet, why is this a new commandment?

12. Building on this premise (and this will be a hint for that which is to come), we have 3 more cause and effect statements. The first one: who is in darkness until now?

13. The second: who abides in the light, and what is the product of abiding in the light?

14. Who walks in darkness, and what is the product of that?

15. In vs. 12-13, John breaks his recipients up into 3 categories. List the categories and their qualifications. Where do you think you fit into this?

16. Next, we have our first command in the whole book! What is it?

17. Building on that commandment, we have another cause and effect question. Who does not have the love of the Father?

36. Building on protocol, John builds if/then statement off of this command as well. What are the 2 results of abiding in Him here?

37. Next, we have another if/then statement to conclude the chapter. Knowing that Jesus is righteous, what is the result of everyone who practices righteousness?

Application

- We see the gravity of the situation: we are living in the last hour! This is evident by the many antichrists that have come (even from among us). In the midst of this, we see the command to let that abide in you which you heard from the beginning. This exhortation to stay planted in the truth of the Gospel of Jesus is so fundamental to our walk. Are you rooted in His Truth, or do you find yourself being pulled away from the Truth by antichrists?
- Pray that you would remain planted in the Truth of the Gospel of Jesus!
- DON'T MOVE!

1. The first thing we are told in this chapter is a command to “Behold.” What are we told to behold here?

 2. How has God shown this type of love?

14. In v. 7, we have another cause and effect where we are told we can be as righteous as Jesus is righteous. What cause is there to become as righteous as Jesus (notice the comparison is practicing righteousness versus continuing in sin)?

 15. In v. 8, we have our next cause and effect. The effect is being "of the devil". What is the cause?

 16. What has the devil been doing from the beginning?

 17. Now we have our 2nd reason for Jesus coming (being manifested). What is it?

 18. Now we have our next cause/effect. The effect is not continuing in a lifestyle of sin. What is the cause?

 19. Why is such a person not continuing to sin?

 20. Now we have a comparison between 2 children. Who are they?

 21. We have 2 qualifications of people who are not of God. What are they (don't forget to put them in the cause/effect list)?

 22. Now we read what the message was that they had heard from the beginning. How does this relate to ch. 2? What is this message?

 23. Remember how people were broken into 2 categories by being called 2 types of children? Here they are developed. Why did Cain murder his brother?

 24. If Cain was under such a mindset, and the world is much like Cain, what shouldn't surprise us about the world's view of us?

 25. In v. 14, we have our next 2 cause and effects. What are they?

Application

- In this chapter, we see an exhortation to love one another as the Lord has loved us and called us His children! With the context of sacrificial service as the definition of love here, do you find yourself loving others as we are commanded to? Taking the converse definition of selfish indulgence, do you find yourself hating others by putting yourself above them and using them to fulfill your desires? Obviously, this is a sobering checkup, but it is so vital to walk how Jesus walked: in selfless love!
- Pray that the Love the Father has poured out on us through His Son Jesus would pour out of us onto everyone we interact with, that you would love as you are called to!

Application

- Here we see a clear-cut line between the Spirit of God and the spirit of the Antichrist. The distinction is one's stance on Jesus. We also see that whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God has God living in Him. God abiding in us has two results here:

1. Victory in Him, as He is greater than he who is in the world
2. A standard of love, that results in the casting out of fear.

With this in mind, are you living in the victory and love of the indwelling God, or do you find yourself caught in fear and a lack of love?

- Remember Who dwells in you and rejoice in His victory!
- With this victory in mind, love as you are called to love: as Jesus loved us!
